As an organization, the ASA does not take a position when there is honest disagreement between Christians on an issue. We are committed to providing an open forum where controversies can be discussed without fear of unjust condemnation. Legitimate differences of opinion among Christians who have studied both the Bible and science are freely expressed within the Affiliation in a context of Christian love and concern for truth.

All posts and comments on ASA blogs are the personal opinion of the writer and not of the organization. They must be consistent with the attitudes expressed in the above paragraphs.

ASA members who have registered for their ASA Online password are automatically registered with the blogs and can use their email address and ASA Online password to log in to submit comments. Posted comments will be reviewed for relevance and will be removed if they do not adhere to this policy or do not contribute substantively to the discussion. We recommend a limit of four comments per person per day.

Topics of posts and comments must relate to issues of science and faith. Although some relevant issues may have a political dimension, posts must not engage in partisan political endorsements or attacks. Posts on topics unrelated to science and faith will be removed. No ad hominem or condescending comments about other contributors to this blog will be accepted: the tone of all comments must be respectful. The identity of each author of a post or comment will be displayed together with the date and time of posting. Authors are responsible for ensuring that all content posted is free of copyright and can be legally posted. Administrators have the right to remove any comments which they deem do not meet these guidelines or are not consistent with the aims and purposes of the ASA.
